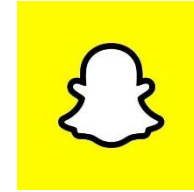

How can we keep the children safe online?

1. Know what your children are doing online - keep an eye on them!
2. Discuss online safety with the children - set boundaries: what is good to share/what isn't & why
3. Use parental controls - set times of the day - set safe spaces in the house where children can be supervised
