PE & Sports Premium Funding
2024 - 2025



At Christchurch CE Primary School, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the pupils. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our pupils. Physical Education and sport clearly contribute to the holistic development of young people and through participation in sport and physical education, the pupils learn more about key values such as teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others. There is significant evidence to show the positive effects of sport and exercise on pupils' physical health, growth and development. Furthermore, sport also provides a healthy environment for young people to learn how to deal with competition and how to cope with both winning and losing.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has provided funding of £150 million per annum over the past academic years (£450 million in total) to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their pupils.

For 2023 - 2024, Christchurch CE Primary School received **£17,400**.

For the year 2024-2025 the funding was £17,670

Purpose of the funding:

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport but will have the freedom to choose how to do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- ✚ To source external agencies to provide high quality after school clubs
- ✚ Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- ✚ Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- ✚ Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in school games
- ✚ Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits
- ✚ Purchase of quality PE and play time equipment

At Christchurch CE Primary School our overall aim will be to continue to improve the quality and breadth of PE provision for all pupils, raising achievement and ensuring a lasting impact.

Funding for 2024 - 2025

✚ Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.
